Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP)

The child/ young person has a persistent need that requires something specific commissioning by the Local Authority to meet their needs. Their need cannot be met through the Local Offer alone.

The plan is co-produced with the child/ young person, their family and relevant agents and agencies involved with their Education, Heath and Care. It is reviewed frequently to ensure it is effectively meeting their needs and moving the individual towards acheiving the intended outcomes. A personal budget can be offered to meet those needs.

Outcome achieved.

Need persists, impacting on progress.

SEND Support Plan

Child/ Young person requires a higher level of ongoing support to meet a more persistent, longer-term need. School/ College is able to meet their needs from within their resources and through the Local Offer. Ongoing involvement of Educational, Health and Care services to help meet the needs and support the continued progress of the child. SEND Support Plan is jointly produced with child/young person and their family, progress tracked and the plan is regularly reviewed and adjusted as child/young person moves towards acheiving outcomes.

Outcome achieved.

Need persists, impacting on progress.

School Support

Child/Young person requires short-term intervention within School/College to bring progress back in line with expectations. Assessment, advice and guidance may be sought from outside agencies to give a better picture of child/young person's needs. Early Help Assessment can be initiated in order to access a range of services to support both child/young person and their family. This can include medical needs.

Outcome achieved.

Pupil makes expected progress across the 4 areas of need:

- Cognition and learning
- Communication and Interaction
- Sensory and/or Physical
- Social, Emotional and Mental Health
